In The Beginning

1999-2019

In the spring of 1997, a group of concerned people gathered together to explore the possibility of organizing an Affiliate Habitat for Humanity in Warren County. Habitat for Humanity International granted that status to Warren County in February, 1998. The next step was to complete an extensive application process for full affiliate status. Many people were involved in the 18 month process to complete the application.

On August 1, 1999, WCHFH received its affiliate status, becoming responsible for all aspects of Habitat home building in Warren County, including fund-raising, site selection, family selection and support, construction and mortgage servicing. It also began a journey to improve the lives of county residents living in expensive, unsafe or unhealthy substandard housing.

Groundbreaking for the first home took place in July, 2000. Since then, fifteen more homes were built in Warren County. This included new single-homes, duplex constructions, and rehabs. During that time WCHFH also opened a ReStore and established a repair program.

In 2019 WCHFH celebrated 10 years of Hope in the Hills, finalized plans to begin a street of six homes, including a Blitz Build, and is beginning construction on the upcoming Community Center.

It's Looking Like a Spring Dedication



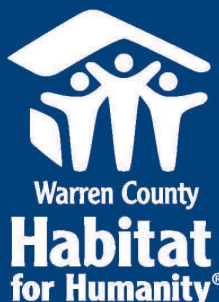
Excitement is in the air as construction on the 17th home, built by WCHFH, located on Dana Street in Lopatcong, begins to look like a home. Many volunteers, along with Josh and Robin Maguire, the current Partner Family, have been diligently working every Thursday and Saturday to keep up with the end goal of completing the home by spring of 2020.

A ceremonial groundbreaking for the Dana Street build took place in June, immediately followed by excavation and block work for the foundation. Volunteers framed the home, and with cooperating weather throughout the summer, the volunteers quickly got the house "in the dry." They are now installing siding and exterior trim.

In addition to the new home, an existing garage on the property has been renovated and will be part of the new homestead. We hope to have the exterior work completed by mid to late October.

In the meantime, the plumber and electrician will soon begin, and once they have finish, the insulation can be installed along with temporary heating. The next step will be interior details; drywall, millwork, flooring, painting, etc. If all goes well we should be nearing build completion by February-March of next year, with a dedication soon to follow.
