Teams from UPS also contributed on two separate days. The UPS Foundation has been a financial supporter for the last three homes built by WCHFH. Through UPS and other's generosity the Maguire family is beginning to feel what it is like to have their dream of owning a home come true.

Since adopting an eco-friendlier model in 2007, Rockefeller Center has partnered with Habitat for Humanity Int'l. to reclaim their trees' wood for building materials.


The walls will be pre-built this winter in a barn located near the site. This will enable the volunteers to complete the framing on July 22nd, the first day of the ten day Blitz Build.

The Blitz Build barn workshop is ready for action, volunteer architect Erin Colins has completed the plans and code enforcement officials are on board. The next step is to get volunteers and donations in place.

The ReStore Serves Veterans





We provide a hand up - not a hand out. Our volunteer run organization builds homes together with our partner families funded by donations from the local community. Those families buy the home at a price based on their ability to pay with an interest free mortgage.

In 20 years of serving Warren County

- We have completed 16 homes and the 17th is under construction now.
- Through tithing we have funded 50 homes built internationally.
- We have built and expanded the ReStore in Washington.
- For 10 years our Hope in the Hills program completed over 225 repair and/or home improvement projects.
- We have become a Veterans Build Affiliate.

2020 is going to be an UNPRECEDENTED year for us!

- For the first time ever a new Habitat (built and operated) Community Center will open in the heart of Washington.
- We will break ground to construct six homes in Franklin Township. SIX!
- Our first Blitz Build – a home built in ten days (start to finish!) will be built from July 22 - August 2, 2020.
- For the first time, two partner families have been selected and are ready to put in sweat equity to build their homes.


