Dear Friends of Warren County Habitat for Humanity,

Stories. We all have our own, unique story of who we are, where we are, and where we would like to be. Sometimes in life, for a myriad of potential reasons, any one of us could find ourselves at a low point in our story where the only way it seems we'll move forward is if someone comes by to help pick us up.

Warren County Habitat for Humanity is a Christian rooted organization serving the community by putting God's love into action and bringing people together to build homes, communities and hope. I've personally been blessed over the last ten years to see so many people dedicated in this mission, and yet can see we're only scratching the surface of helping the number of those impacted by the housing crisis.

Through various studies I can cite the statistics of how approximately a third of the homes in Warren County are rentals with steep costs, or that nearly 40% of our population is just barely skating by, working hard, earning above the federal poverty level, but not able to afford a basic household budget of housing, childcare, food, transportation, and health care.

The real mission of Habitat is not only in statistics though, but in the stories of helping families together in service, picking each other up in a practical expression of God's love. Through those efforts we are not only helping a family in that snapshot moment of time and immediate need, but making generational impact for them, their children and their children's children. We do this through our Homeownership Program, Critical Home Repair and Home Preservation Programs, the ReStore, and our Community Center. But we also do it equally by connecting behind the scenes in impactful ways, both big and small.

Give a ring or drop a message! I'd love to be able to share with you the joys of what it means to be part of the Habitat family, whether partnering in one of our programs or volunteering! While these are exciting times with the scope of our organization growing larger and helping more families than ever before, we are desperately in need of more dedicated volunteers of all kinds. As we say at Habitat, you don't need to swing a hammer to make a difference!



The **Critical Home Repair** and **Hope in the Hills of Warren** Programs are applicable for seniors, those with a disability, or families with circumstances who struggle to maintain the integrity of their homes. The programs emphasize support of aging people so their home can be made accessible. The initiatives provide home repairs to prevent homeowners from suffering injuries and falls, accidents or moving out of their home.

Critical Home Repair: A Personal Story

Jim Monteleone is a Veteran who served on the beaches of Normandy in

World War II. As a long time resident of Warren County, Jim and wife Trudy had built themselves a home in Oxford, NJ where they lived for many years. On February 16, 2020 as Jim was mowing his lawn, his lawnmower backfired, police later determined, causing the home he built with his own two hands to burn to the ground. The couple was not physically injured, but the fire did take an emotional toll. As Jim and Trudy purchased another home on the other side of Warren County, they maintained a fear of fire and the need for fire escapability in the event of another unforseen accident.





The ReStore celebrated its 10th anniversary of serving the community by providing new or slightly used household goods at below market value prices, generating revenue which then funds our mission of building safe and affordable homes in partnership with qualified families. For the first time the ReStore topped \$1 million in revenue. More than 282,000 items were sold. Thank you to all those who donated their home goods, to the 316 volunteers who donated their time and effort and our enthusiastic and innovative staff for managing our ever expanding operations.


One of the many ways COVID-19 affected our organization was having to reevaluate our approach to volunteerism. For almost 2 years, our build crew had half the amount of volunteers it did before COVID, and even had to put all construction on hold for indeterminate periods of time. Those that were still able to volunteer wore masks, performed regular health checks and distanced as much as they could. The health and safety of our volunteers and community is our top priority, which understandably led to outside groups being unable to participate during that time.

April of 2022 saw the first outside organization in over two years join the Warren Habitat team to help prepare the Community Center for its official grand opening. Since then, at least one outside organization has volunteered with Warren County Habitat per month. Our regular volunteer crew is back up to its usual amount of 12-15 volunteers per build day. We could not be more grateful for the determination and dedication of our volunteers, and for the medical advances made to help make safe volunteerism possible once again.





